Minutes of the proceedings of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Gueydan, Louisiana, taken at regular meeting held Tuesday, September 7, 2021, at 6:00 o'clock P.M.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Gueydan, Louisiana met in regular session with Mayor Jude Reese presiding and the following Aldermen present:

Present: CLAUDETTE PRICE, JOHN LASETER, SCOTT VALLO, ANITA DUPUIS & JASON SUIRE

Absent: NONE

Public Comment any item on agenda (3 minutes per person)

Motion was made by JASON SUIRE seconded by JOHN LASETER, and carried, that in as much as each member of the Board of Aldermen received a copy of minutes taken at Regular Meeting of August 3, 2021, that the reading of said minutes be dispensed with and same be adopted as written.

Motion by JOHN LASETER, seconded by JASON SUIRE, and carried, that the reports of the Bookkeeper and Tax Collector be approved as filed.

Motion by JASON SUIRE, seconded by JOHN LASETER, and carried that the following transfer, on the date, and amount from fund is hereby ratified and approved:

## To General Fund:

August 09, 2021, Utility Fund \$50,000.00 August 24, 2021, Utility Fund \$40,000.00

Motion by JOHN LASETER seconded by CLAUDETTE PRICE and carried to accept the billing adjustments in the amount of \$6,258.77 for the month of August 2021.

Larry Cramer, engineer with Sellers & Associates presented the governing authority with the bid tabulations for the Street Improvements Grant and informed those in attendance that the lowest bid was approximately \$58,000.00 over budget. Mr. Cramer stated he would inquire with the contractor on what could maybe be eliminated and such. A change order maybe needed for the bid.

The LCDBG project update – contractor has completed the force main to the sewer plant. The 3<sup>rd</sup> street and Boatner issue was due to poor compaction and has been repaired. Other issues have been repaired as well.

Demolition work is being performed on the lift station on 5<sup>th</sup> street and are awaiting on pumps to arrive.

Mr. Cramer presented partial payment #4 to Southern Constructors in the amount of \$48,311.46 and informed the governing authority that the project is 62% complete. Motion by SCOTT VALLO seconded by JOHN LASETER and carried to accept partial payment #4.

Mr. Cramer presented Change Order #3 to increase contract time by 61 calendar days due to abnormal weather and site conditions as shown on the records from January to August 2021(it was said at the meeting to October 31, 2021 which was incorrect). Motion by JASON SUIRE, seconded by JOHN LASETER and carried to accept change order #3 presented by Southern Constructors, LLC.

Mayor's comments: Mayor Jude Reese informed those present that the Town has received the first payment of the American Rescue Plan Act monies in the amount of \$249,248.50 to be used for Sewer, Water and Broadband. Mayor Reese stated the first monies will be used for Sewer Plant repairs. Mayor Reese also informed those present that the town was awarded a 2020-2021 LGAP grant for a sport utility vehicle (side by side). Mayor Reese told those present those volunteers are bringing supplies to those affected by Hurricane Ida. Mayor Reese requested a motion and second to adjourn. Motion by SCOTT VALLO, seconded by JOHN LASETER and carried to adjourn. Citizens of the town spoke up and asked that the agenda be amended, therefore, Mayor Reese reopened the meeting. Motion by JASON SUIRE, seconded by JOHN LASETER and carried to amend the agenda to include Ms. Vanessa Maxile to speak. Ms. Maxile speaking on behalf of other citizens present spoke to the governing authority on the issue of the power charge on the utility bills. Ms. Maxile requested information and filled out a public records request at the meeting. Ms. Maxile requested that a CLECO representative be present at the next regular meeting. Ms. Maxile was informed that a representative will be contacted to be in attendance. There being no further business to come before the meeting thereupon motion by JASON SUIRE, seconded by JOHN LASETER, and carried the meeting thereupon adjourned at 7:03 o'clock P.M. on this 7<sup>TH</sup> day of September,2021.
