Mayor Chris Theriot advised the Governing Authority that he had attended a meeting with the Vermilion Parish Police Jury concerning the issues of the flooding debris and suggested that an Intergovernmental Agreement be signed between the Town and the Vermilion Parish Policy Jury. Motion by GALE SMITH, seconded by JASON SUIRE and carried to give Mayor Chris Theriot the authority to sign all the necessary documents to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Town of Gueydan and the Vermilion Parish Police Jury.

Mayor Theriot informed the Governing Authority he had met with the Army Corp of Engineers for the Town Levee and voiced the concerns of the Levee breach on pure oil road. Helicopters are going to be

brought in to put large sand bags along the breach to stop the flooding into town. The Town levee was repaired with approximately 500 tons of limestone plus fill sand.

There being no further business to come before the meeting thereupon motion SCOTT VALLO, seconded by JASON SUIRE, and carried the meeting thereupon adjourned at 5:45 o'clock P.M. on this 19TH day of August, 2016.
